


2017 contributions: \$410.02 billion by source (in billions of dollars — all figures are rounded)

2017 Gifts

Individuals comprised 70% of all gifts

Foundations amounted to 16% of all gifts

Bequests accounted for 9% of all gifts

Individuals, bequest, and family foundations amounted to an estimated 86% of total giving

Corporations comprised 5% of total giving

2017

- EDUCATION: +6.2% (14% of all giving)
- HUMAN SERVICES: +5.1% (12% of all giving)
- FOUNDATIONS: +6% (11% of all giving)
- HEALTH: +15.5% (9% of all giving)
- PUBLIC-SOCIETY BENEFIT: +7.8% increase (7%)

2017

- INTERNATIONAL: -8.7% (6% of all giving)
- ARTS, CULTURE & HUMANITIES: +8.7% (5%)
- ENVIRONMENT/ANIMALS: +7.2% (3%)
- RELIGIOUS: +2.9% (31%)

Giving Ratio for \$200,000+ Bracket: 2.46%






2015 Giving Ratio – Upstate vs. Downstate








2015 Giving Ratio – All Income Brackets






Giving Ratio – All Income Brackets






2015 Giving Ratio - \$100,000 - \$200,000 Income Bracket






Giving Ratio — \$100,000 - \$200,000 Income Bracket




2015 Giving Ratio – \$200,000+ Income **Bracket**

Syracuse Charitable Giving Gap Relative to **Upstate Peers**

- Small changes in the overall giving ratio can have a significant effect on total charitable contributions
 - If Syracuse contributed at the Rochester giving ratio, 2015 contributions would have been \$70.3 million higher.
 - If Syracuse contributed at the Albany giving ratio, 2015 contributions would have been \$50.0 million higher.
- Charitable giving among the top income bracket is a key factor in the overall gap
 - If Syracuse's top earners contributed at same rate as Rochester's, 2015 contributions would have been \$64.5 million higher
 - If Syracuse's top earners contributed at same rate as Albany's, 2015 contributions would have been \$58.8 million higher

Key Takeaways

- Syracuse's top income bracket contributes to charities and nonprofits at a lower rate than the Upstate New York average and peers Rochester and Albany
- From 2013 2015, the giving ratio for Syracuse's top income bracket declined from 2.69% to 2.46%.
 - Caused charitable giving to decline by \$3 million
- Moderate increase in giving among high earners could close much of the gap
 - Contributing at same rate as Rochester would generate \$70.3 million more in donations
 - Contributing at same rate as Albany would generate \$50.0 million more in donations
- Charitable giving in the \$100,000 \$200,000 income bracket is mostly on par with Upstate New York peers

Volunteering

NYS ranks 49th in the nation

Decline occurring across the nation

Research shows a link between volunteering and donating

Volunteers donate on average 10X more than non-volunteers

Nearly 70% of people surveyed said they donate to the organization for which they volunteer.


