Let's Start with Good News


- While COVID 19 has impacted many industries, construction has, for the most part, held up ok
- An industry focused on safety was able to pivot quickly and adopt new practices and policies
- It helped us advocate that construction remain essential
 - ▶ This is important given the Governor's new tactic of Yellow, Orange and Red Zones
- Overall feedback is 2020 has been a good year for construction

Uncertainty is the Flavor for Now

- COVID 19 continues to be a dominant force even with the news of a vaccine
- The industry is still trying to figure out how to navigate the contractual issues brought on by the virus
 - Project delays
 - Supply line disruption
 - Labor shortages d/t \$600 weekly unemployment benefit
- > The market seems to have figured it out, but concern still exists about investment
- The prospect of additional lockdowns hasn't helped, with investors remaining too uncertain to bring the next generation of commercial projects to market
- Office properties, mixed use, lodging and retail remain somewhat flat
- 2021 is shaping up to be a challenging year for many contractors

 - Do they get extended and for how long?
- Congressman Jacobs Scaffold Law Reform
- Infrastructure
- State
 - \$60B deficit over next 4 years
 - CHIPS funding already cut, OGS sitting on projects
 - Legalized Adult Use Recreational Marijuana
 - Expansion of Prevailing Wage to Private Work
 - Public Subsidy Board, Definition of Construction
 - Scaffold Law Comparative Negligence
 - M/WBE
 - General business issues: Unemployment Insurance, Workers Compensation, Single Payer Healthcare

There is Hope

- According to the BLS, since the early stages of the pandemic, the industry has recovered more than 800,000 jobs or 74% of the initial job loss
- Industry added 27,000 jobs in November
- A crisis is a terrible thing to waste. COVID 19 exposed many of our state's flaws and we need to capitalize on them
 - Mandates on business and local governments can be reformed WITHOUT losing income for the state or raising taxes
- New York made the Property Tax Cap permanent limiting the growth of property taxes
- Congress seems poised to pass another stimulus bill that should have state/local government assistance
